## **€29 Million PEACE IV Shared Education Programme**

### **Launched**

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The GBA recently attended the official launch of CASE, Collaboration and Sharing in Education, a €29 million fund which is being taken forward by the Education Authority in partnership with the Irish education funding body, Léargas.

The CASE project, which will run until 2022, is intended to enable 280 schools and 135,000 pupils to take part in shared education through local partnerships on a cross-sectoral and cross-border basis.

The project is aimed at both primary and post-primary schools with limited or no experience in shared education programmes. According to the EA, the emphasis will be on "sustainable curricular based sharing, delivering internally by partnership staff, and developing a culture of collaboration, supporting school improvement for all young people within communities."

Funding has been provided through the EU's PEACE IV programme, with match funding provided by the Department for Education and the Department for Education and Skills in the Republic of Ireland.

To date, over 89 local partnerships involving over 200 schools with a funding commitment of close to €1 million has been approved.
