First-time Principals and Vice-Principals Training

Introduction:

The Leadership, Management and Governance Team in the School Development Service has organised two leadership programmes during this academic year to meet the professional learning needs of first-time Principals and first-time Vice-Principals in all types of schools in Northern Ireland. A total of 110 first-time Principals and 83 Vice-Principals were registered on the induction programmes last year (2018-2019).

First-time Principals and First-time Vice-Principals

The content of the courses combined a range of leadership and management modules which were facilitated by a range of personnel from four of the directorates within the Education Authority and also ETI and experienced school leaders. The first-time Principal programme comprised nine days' training which included areas such as finance, human resources, legal issues, the inspection process, building leadership capacity, vision and values, developing self and others, coaching and mentoring, and leading and managing change. The first-time Principals also had access to a mentor to support them through their first year in post.

The first-time Vice-Principal programme provided five days' training focussing on Qualities of effective leadership and Management (Day 1); Finance and effective governance (Day 2); ETI inspection process and raising standards (Day 3); Recruitment and selection, leading effective teams (Day 4) and School development planning and action planning (Day 5).

The programme for Principals will commence in September 2019 and the Vice-Principal programme in November.

Any Principal or Vice-Principal who was appointed during the period January 2019-January 2020 is eligible to attend. Anyone wishing to be registered for either of these programmes should contact Jenny Anderson at jenny.anderson@eani.org.uk

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Upper Pay Scale (UPS) progression

The Department have issued information and guidance outlining the Upper Pay Scale progression arrangements from September 2019.

Teachers in post on 1 September 2019 who moved to point 1 of the Upper Pay Scale on or before 1 September 2017 are eligible to be considered for progression to point 2 of the Upper Pay Scale from 1 September 2019.

The Principal, in approving the movement of an individual teacher, needs to ensure the teacher was placed on UPS1 on or before 1 September 2017 and has two consecutive successful Performance Review and Staff Development (PRSD) review statements.
