Education Restart

Expert Panel on Educational Underachievement Established

The Education Minister has announced the appointment of an Expert Panel to examine the links between educational underachievement and social disadvantage.

The panel has been established under the 'New Decade, New Approach' agreement which sets out the requirement for an expert group to examine and address links between persistent educational underachievement and socio-economic background, including the long-standing issues facing working-class Protestant boys.

The panel members are:

- Dr Noel Purdy will Chair the panel. He is currently the Director of Research and Scholarship at Stranmillis University College, where he is also the Director of the Centre for Research in Educational Underachievement.
- Mary Montgomery is currently the Principal of Belfast Boys Model School which has one of the highest levels of attainment for Protestant FSM boys coming from an area of economic deprivation.
- Kathleen O'Hare recently retired as the Principal of Hazelwood Integrated College, and was formerly Principal of St Cecilia's College.
- Joyce Logue is the Principal of Longtower Primary in Derry/Londonderry which predominantly serves a pupil population within areas of significant economic and social deprivation such as the Brandywell and Bogside.

- Jackie Redpath is the Chief Executive of the Greater Shankill
 Partnership and he has significant and longstanding experience
 addressing the issue of educational under-achievement,
 particularly with FSM Protestant Boys within a community setting.
- Professor Feyisa Demie is an Honorary Professor at the School of Education at Durham University and also head of research for school self-evaluation at Lambeth Local Authority in London. He has worked extensively with government departments for over 25 years in the use of data and research to raise educational achievement.

The Panel will engage with organisations which have experience of the issues associated with educational underachievement. This includes parents and children as well as the wider education sector, government, the voluntary and community sector, business representative organisations and the Northern Ireland Commissioner for Children and Young People.
