Consultations Update - February 2023

Education Welfare Service - Transformation Project Report

The Education Authority's Education Welfare Service (EWS) is consulting on its transformation project report to enable the views of all stakeholders to be considered and to inform the implementation of the recommendations.

The report covers a number of areas including:

 A new service delivery model based on prevention and early intervention based on research and stakeholder engagement.

- An Outcome Based Accountability framework to allow the service to monitor and improve performance.
- An Implementation Plan to help deliver on the recommendations from the Transformation Project.

CCEA survey for students, parents, and teachers on the Summer 2023 support arrangements

CCEA has developed a short <u>survey</u> to gauge audiences understanding and knowledge of the support arrangements for students sitting CCEA examinations this summer.

The survey also aims to find out if students, parents, and teachers are receiving information in a way which is accessible to them, using their preferred channels of communication.

This information will help gauge current understanding of the support arrangements such as the <u>provision of Advance Information</u> and help shape the future communications on Summer 2023.

The survey will close on 7th March 2023.

Area Planning Update

The Education Authority (EA), in partnership with sectoral bodies, is currently working to meet demand for Specialist Provision in Mainstream Schools (SPiMs) for September 2023 and beyond. Work is also being undertaken to look at how specialist provision works in practice in a voluntary grammar school. This includes consideration of various factors including curriculum, staffing and accommodation.

Shared Education News

Blended learning in Shared Education

Twenty teachers from 8 shared education partnerships, including three voluntary grammar schools, recently took part in a two-day online course as part of Ulster University's REBEL project, led by Professor Roger Austin, to learn how to extend their face-to-face contacts by using online communication tools.

Teachers created 6-week projects to use a range of online tools, put the projects into action with their pupils and came back together to share insights on teaching, learning and shared education with the group. Read more about the projects here.

APG Holds First Inquiry Session

The All Party Group (APG) on Reducing Harm Related to Gambling met on the 13th of February for the first oral evidence session of its <u>inquiry into public</u> <u>health approaches to tackling gambling-related harms</u>. The group heard evidence from Dr Joanna Purdy and Dr Helen McAvoy of the Insitute of Public Health (IPH) and Matt Zarb-Cousin of Gamban and Clean Up Gambling.

Dr Purdy and Dr McAvoy emphasised the importance of a population level public health approach that protects the health and wellbeing of the entire population, including children and young people. Matt Zarb-Cousin emphasised that younger age groups tend to engage in higher risk and more frequent gambling. This is compounded by the prevalence of online gambling, and easy access via smartphones. Young people are also particularly vulnerable to addition and addictive behaviours in general.

CCEA Gambling and Gaming Awareness Resource

Gambling related harm can be financial, relational, emotional, psychological, and/or physical and it impacts on the wellbeing of individuals, families, and communities, regardless of wealth, education, or gender.

While research is limited by the newness and reach of online gaming in today's world, concern is also rising that similar harms may also be linked to in-game spending on items such as loot boxes and skins.

In relation to this, CCEA has produced a resource to support teachers delivering the statutory curriculum for Learning for Life and Work (LLW): Personal Development to Key Stage 3 pupils, with a focus on gaming and gambling awareness. More information is available here.

TikTok Safety Guides Launched

TiKTok safety guidance documents were recently launched on Safer Internet Day (7th February) by Safer Schools NI, The Department of Education, and the Education Authority. The guides are designed to enhance support in relation to social media, providing advice to schools, parents and carers on the basics of how TikTok works, the potential risks associated with it and helpful tips on how to best support children and young people on the use of such platforms.
