DE Launches Consultation on Education Budget Allocation

The Department of Education has launched a public consultation on the equality implications following the announcement by the Secretary of State on the 2023-24 budget allocations.

The <u>consultation document</u> details the Department's proposed 2023-24 Budget allocations and how they will impact on its ability to deliver public services, in the midst of the current cost of living crisis.

The Department welcomes comment on any aspects of this document. Interested parties are encouraged to make responses by **13 August 2023**, which will be used to inform further mitigation measures and reallocation of any additional funding available during 2023-24.

The GBA will be submitting a response to the consultation and planning a programme of engagement to address the grave concerns around the Education Budget.

Education Cuts - "Rapid Response" Report Published

A "rapid response" report, " The Consequences of the Cuts to Education for

Children and Young People in Northern Ireland" has been written by academics from Queen's University Belfast, Ulster University, Stranmillis University College and Newcastle University, providing an analysis of the consequences of the funding reductions and lack of investment across multiple aspects of education provision in Northern Ireland.

All Ireland Scholarships 2023

The All Ireland Scholarship Scheme which is funded by JP McManus provides financial support to high achieving students from low income households.

The scholarship offers students financial support of £5,500 per annum for the duration of their course.

Twenty five scholarships will be awarded to students who attend a grant aided post primary school or a Further Education College in Northern Ireland.

- Nineteen Scholarships will be awarded to the top 'A' Level students from grant aided Post Primary Schools. A minimum of two Scholarships will be offered in each county based on where students live.
- Six Scholarships will be awarded to the top Level 3 Extended
 Diploma students from Further Education Colleges. One Scholarship will be awarded in each of the six Further Education Colleges.

Applicants must have been in receipt of the Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) at the time of examination, and due to commence an undergraduate course in university in the academic year of 2023/2024.

The deadline for receipt of applications is 4pm on Thursday 31 August 2023.

GBA Attends Research Launch

The GBA recently attended a research event at Queen's University Belfast for the launch of the report: 'Experiences of Education Among Minority Ethnic Groups in Northern Ireland' which examined the school experiences among minority ethnic and migrant families.

The research focused on four main topics: school admissions and transfer; school life and peer relationships; curriculum issues including representation of diversity and English language learning; and home-school relationships.

Key findings include:

- Some parents spoke about the risk of special educational needs (SEN)
 being missed among children with English as an additional language or
 the difficulty of having concerns or diagnoses recognised by the school.
- Experiences of verbal and physical racist bullying, as well as direct and indirect discrimination, are widely reported by families.
- Children and parents largely have positive views on learning and sharing about cultural and religious diversity at school, but some identify a need

for greater representation of diversity in the curriculum, particularly in subjects such as history and religious education.
